INTEREST ON THE UNPAID BALANCE OF THE NOTES ACCRUES AT THE PRIME RATE PLUS TWO PERCENT PER ANNUM, ADJUSTED ANNUALLY. MANY FUTURES, INC.

PROVIDES THE SOFTWARE/WEB PLATFORM THAT ENABLES THE FOUNDATION TO SOLICIT FUNDS FROM DONORS FOR THE FOUNDATION APPROVED PROJECTS. AT THE FISCAL YEARS END OF MARCH 31, 2004 AND 2005, THE UNPAID BALANCE ON THE CONVERTIBLE NOTES IS \$392,370 AND \$1,624,391, RESPECTIVELY.

THIS TOTAL IS COMPRISED OF TWO PARTS, A SHORT-TERM ADVANCE OF \$22,806 AND \$1,624,391 IN CONVERTIBLE NOTES. THESE NOTES CONVERT INTO MANY FUTURES, INC. EQUITY BASED UPON CERTAIN CONTINGENT FUTURE EVENTS, SUCH THAT THE FOUNDATION WOULD BECOME AN EQUITY OWNER OF MANY FUTURES, INC. THE FOUNDATION ALSO PAID MANY FUTURES, INC. \$51,315 FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE ORGANIZATION, AS WELL AS \$64,859 FOR DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF GLOBAL GIVING'S WEBSITE.

TWO OFFICERS OF THE FOUNDATION ARE ALSO OFFICERS OF MANY FUTURES, INC. AND ONE ADDITIONAL OFFICER OF THE FOUNDATION IS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MANY FUTURES, INC.
